

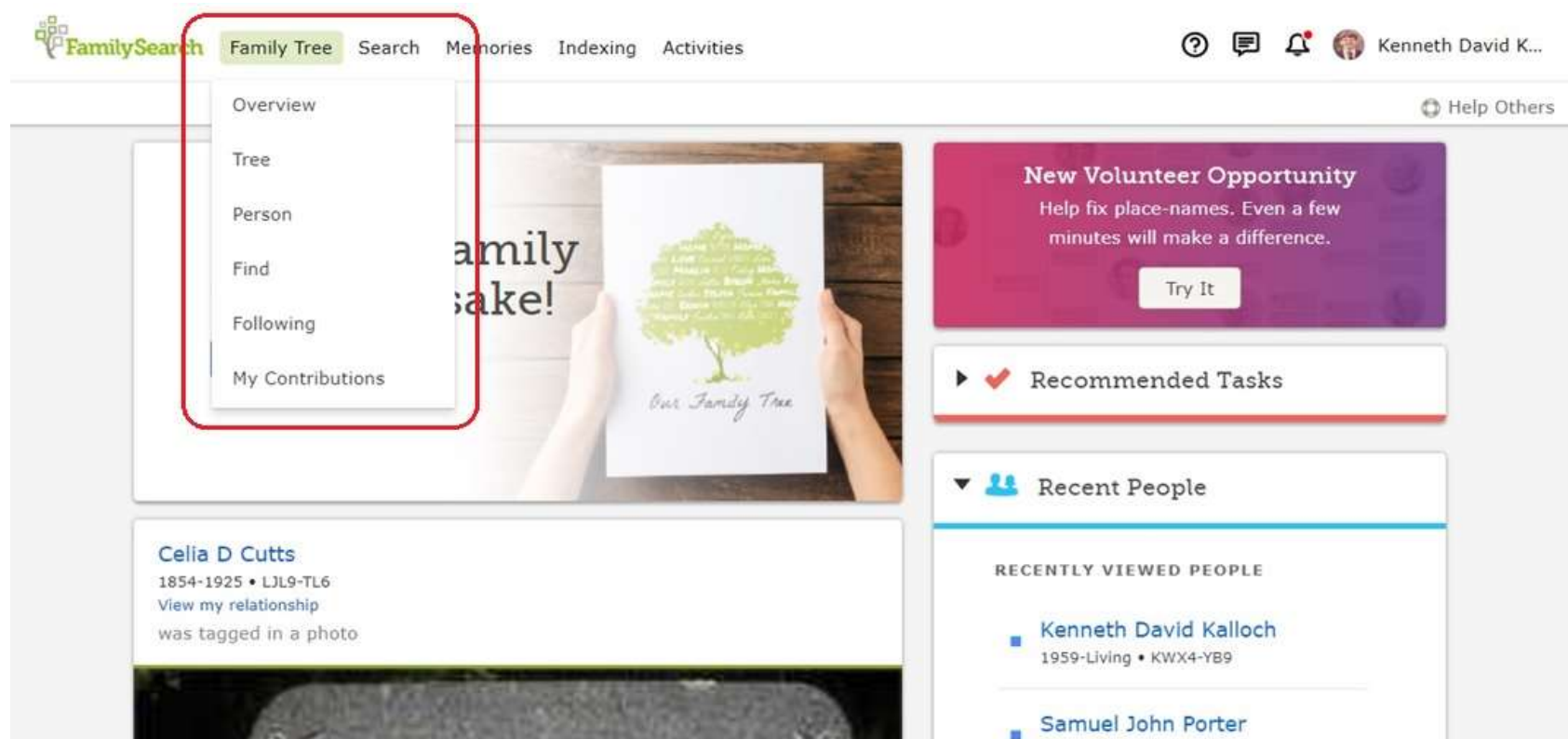

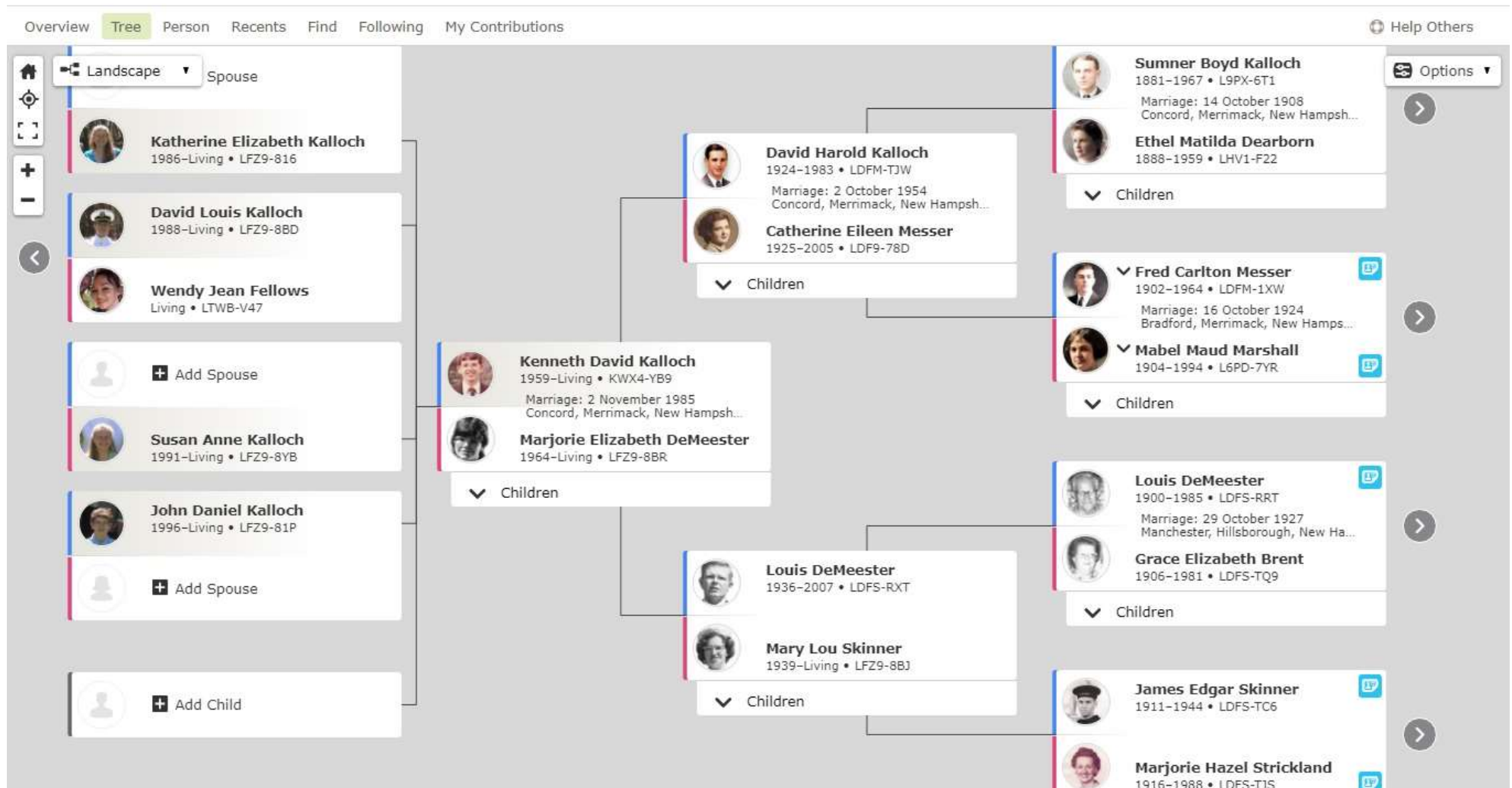
Clicking on Family Tree shows these options

Be sure to read “Overview” (it explains how the tree is one large collaborative tree with 1.2 billion people).



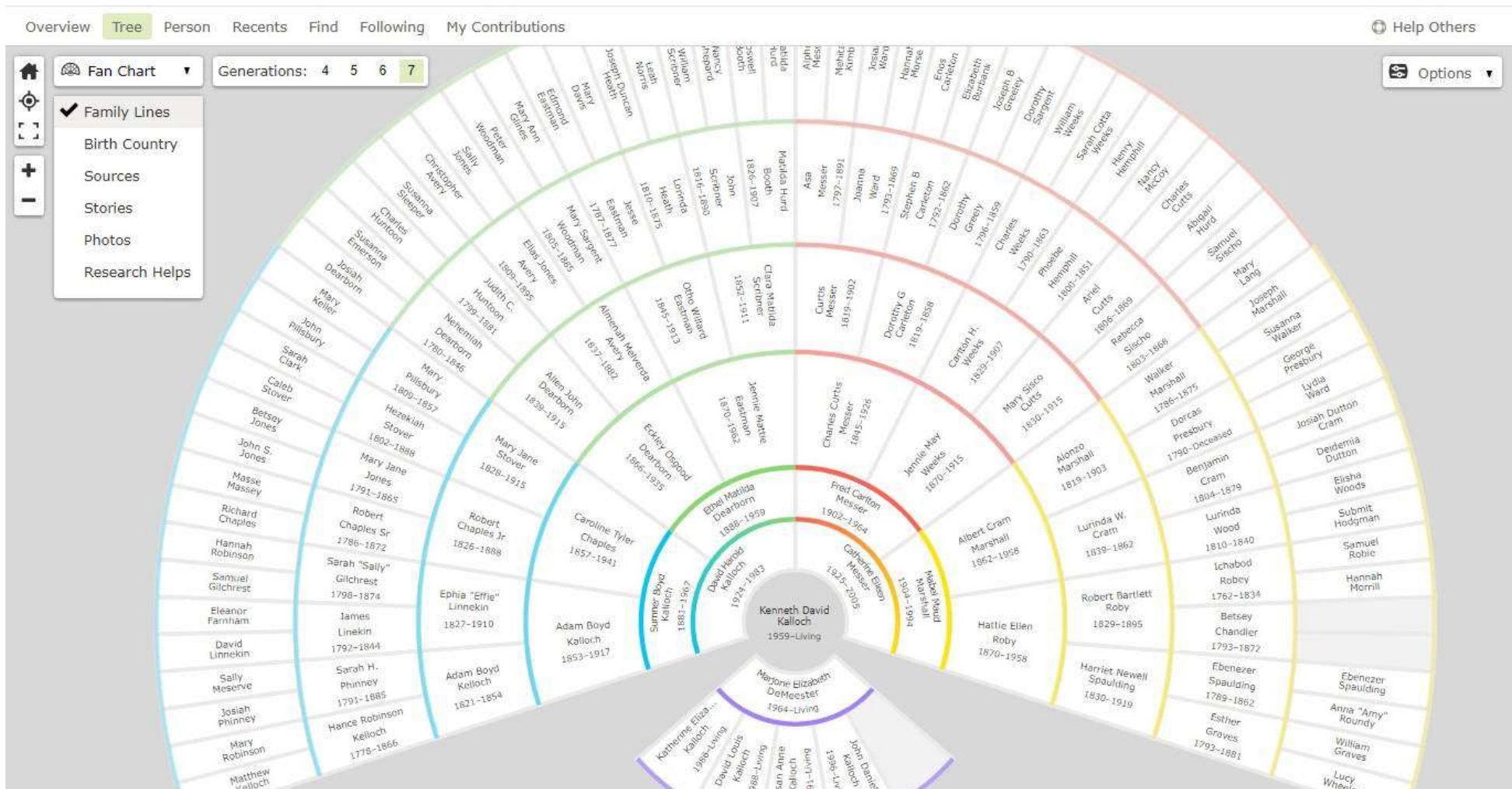
Clicking on Tree will show your tree

You just need to connect to it.**

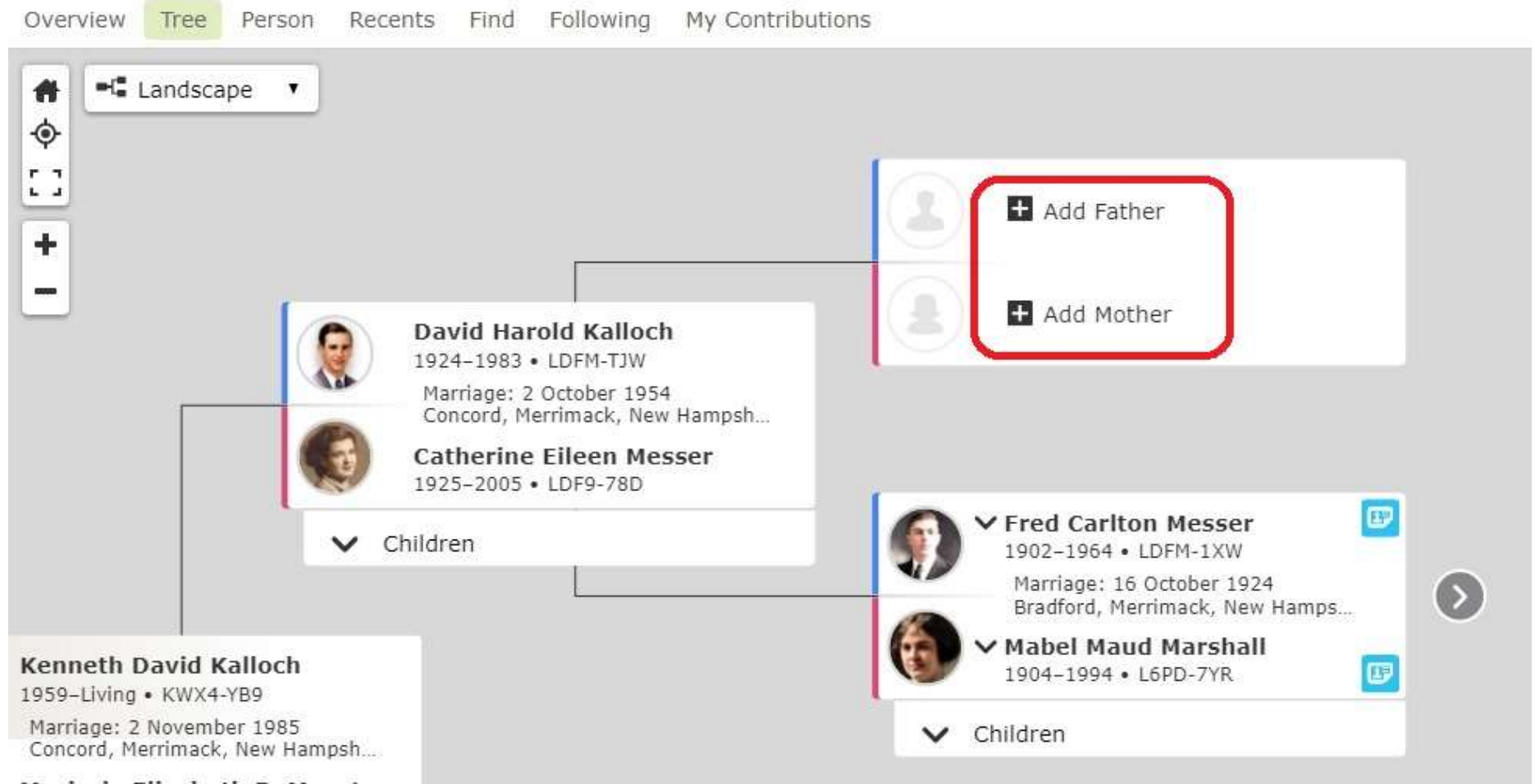
Most of our Kalloch Family Tree is already entered.







Everyone in the tree is given a unique ID number which is 4 digits, followed by a hyphen, and 3 digits. You can add, find, or merge people in the tree by using their ID numbers.

Editing Relationship Information is Easy
